Oliver is Director of Illicit Finance Policy at The Sentry. The Sentry's mission is to expose the links between dirty money and violence. The Sentry follows the money—investigating and holding to account war profiteers and kleptocrats. Oliver leads The Sentry's illicit finance policy work, which includes engagement with government stakeholders and private sector actors around the world. He focuses in particular on the use of financial tools of pressure including sanctions and business advisories and their use in relation to conflict and associated human rights violations.

A qualified solicitor in England and Wales (non-practising), Oliver spent over seven years as a legal officer at the United Nations, working in the trial and appeals chambers at the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda and International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia.

Oliver has served as independent counsel, consultant and advisor to numerous civil society organisations, bar associations, regional bodies and individuals. He has appeared in cases before several international and regional courts and bodies including the International Criminal Court, African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights, UN Human Rights Committee, and UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention.
